- men's briefs, especially sizes 30, 32, 34, and 36
- women's underwear, sizes 6 and 7
- men's white undershirts, sizes lg and x-lg
- regular crew length (or longer) white socks for men and women
- washcloths and towels (new or used)
- deodorant
- razors with at least two blades
- blankets
- men's clothes (they have plenty of women's clothes)
- men's shoes
